Conference Objective:

This expert conference will convene NGOs, business leaders, medical and humanitarian professionals, and digital innovators to strengthen partnerships and co-create a cooperative roadmap for Ukraine's recovery. Through panel discussions, presentations, and targeted networking, participants will exchange strategies and spotlight concrete solutions that are both adaptable in times of war and scalable in peace. The sessions will also generate insights that respond to two overarching strategic questions, guiding efforts toward sustainable post-war reconstruction and economic resilience.

The outcomes are intended to be presented of a joint presentation at the Ukraine Recovery Conference in Rome (URC2025).

Guiding Questions

Wartime & Peacetime Guiding questions:

1. Inclusive Recovery:

What strategies ensure that economic recovery benefits all social groups, including marginalized communities and activists?

2. Civil Society Impact:

How can insights from civil society shape reconstruction efforts—especially business-led ones—so they reflect real community needs?

3. Cross-Sector Collaboration:

Which forms of cooperation between civil society and businesses are most effective for sustaining recovery efforts during wartime instability?

4. Activity Alignment:

How can overlapping initiatives on similar themes be aligned or synchronized to maximize impact and avoid duplication?

5. Strategic Communication:

How should PR, marketing, reporting, and outreach be designed to clearly communicate needs and results to potential donors and grantmakers?

Panel Guiding Questions:

Humanitarian Aid - what works, what doesn't?

Which humanitarian programs remain essential, which require adaptation, and where are redundancies or gaps in current response structures? How can civil society and (businesses) and co-develop job creation strategies for IDPs, women, and veterans.

Medical Response

Which approaches to trauma care and rehabilitation are proving successful? What structural support does Ukraine's strained health system require, especially for complex cases and cross-border care?

Investment & Economic Resilience -

What role should social ventures and crowdfunding platforms play in Ukraine's rebuilding? What tools can mitigate the risk of ethical investment in reconstruction?

Re:build - Reconstruction & Digital Solutions

How can Ukraine attract investment that aligns with ethical standards and long-term resilience rather than short-term exploitation? How can local self-governments and regional administrations take the lead in Ukraine's reconstruction—ensuring transparent processes, equitable access to funding, and long-term regional resilience?

- **Presentations (max. 10 minutes):** Individual NGOs and initiatives present their work. Please introduce your NGO/ initiatives no longer than a minute + than focus on solution for Ukraine in times of war + in case of peace: please keep in mind our guiding questions.
